Students will have continued access to athletics, extracurricular clubs, and meal services while attending the Online Academy.

## Online Learning Overview: Accessing Instruction



All online students will access course content (links to individual classes, coursework, and materials) through AESD's newly adopted learning management system, Canvas. Schedules and links to teacher Webex sessions will be available in Canvas as well. All students and parents will be required to complete a mandatory onboarding class, which will explain how to access and use Canvas.

### 🔅 CANVAS

Monday through Friday, students will login to Canvas and join live instruction throughout the day via their teacher's courses and Webex links within the Canvas learning platform. Although students will attend live instructions with their teachers Mondays through Friday, students have access to online learning coursework 24 hours a day and may complete that work any day of the week, at any time of day.

Below is an outline of the AOA Personalized Learning Continuum and Levels of Student Autonomy. As online learners progress through each level of autonomy, they earn badges in Canvas to demonstrate their increased competency with managing online learning

#### Level One: Pathfinder

•85-100% synchronous learning time

- I require frequent reminders of proper technology use and Digital Citizenship expectations OR I am currently working to compete the Digital Citizenship Course in Canvas.
- •I am beginning to talk to my teacher about what it means to **navigate my learning path** and how viewing lesson videos that my teacher has uploaded into Canvas AND/OR moving through one Canvas module a week at my own pace will be a part of this process.
- Follows prescriptive learning and engagement plan from teacher
- •Requires adult support to achieve goals
- •At least one office hour support meeting with teacher/week
- Student meets weekly reflection goals at least 70% of the time

- •I am setting my first goal for **navigating my learning path** by viewing 1-2 lesson videos a week at my own pace that my teacher has uploaded into Canvas AND/OR accelerating through one Canvas module at my own pace.
- I periodically need reminders about proper use of technology and digital citizenship expectations when engaging with my peers and teachers online.
- •Office hour support meeting with teacher every other week
- Student meets weekly reflection goals at least 80% of the time
- Student receives consistent supports from teachers and/or site admin in meeting minimum weekly instructional minutes.
- Student is passing approximately 80% of mastery checks
- Student is earning 80% of badges for competency-based learning progression

### Arizona Attendance Procedures and Expectations for Online Students

In accordance with A.R.S. § 15-808 E and J: Arizona Online Instruction, the state has defined minimum instructional hours that every online student must achieve. Students will maintain an electronic weekly log to record instructional minutes and the parent and/or guardian will submit the minimum instructional minutes. Students and parents will receive training on how to maintain and submit the weekly log using the *Time Tracker* tool in Synergy 's ParentVUE and StudentVUE portals. Please note, failure to consistently maintain and submit the weekly log of minimum instructional minutes could result in dismissal from the Arizona K-8 Online Academy. *AESD daily student learning schedules account for the required minutes by the state as AESD's commitment to providing students with a comprehensive and robust educational experience.*

### **Time Tracker Electronic Log**

Student's daily logs are entered, in hours and minutes. Student's daily logs are entered, in minutes, and submitted in StudentVUE / ParentVUE. Follow the steps below to enter daily minutes.

How to Complete a Daily Minutes Entry:

- 1. Login to StudentVue / ParentVue
- 2. Select the Attendance Tab
- 3. Click on Time Tracker on the right side above the calendar
- 4. Enter the minutes per class period / session. Refer to the number of minutes from the chart *AESD Minimum Weekly Instructional Minutes per Student* on page 16
  - It is best to enter minutes rather than hours
  - Do not enter both minutes AND hours in an entry
- 5. Click Update Times to save minutes that were entered and recalculate totals at the end of each submission
- 6. Using the ParentVUE phone app to enter the daily time log works fine, but the process is much quicker on a laptop

How to Submit Minutes / Log Weekly:

- 1. Login to ParentVUE (cannot complete this using StudentVue)
- 2. Check that Total Time displays all of the hours and minutes entered for the week for all classes / subjects (any minutes not added for a day/class/subject must be updated first)
- 3. Click update and submit to check that all of the submitted times are correct, and submit the minutes for the week. Each Monday morning starts a new school week, make sure the week befores times are completed by Friday afternoon.
  - No changes to minutes can be made once Update and Submit are clicked
  - The ParentVUE phone app can be used, but the process is much quicker on a laptop

Students enrolled at the Arizona K-8 Online Academy will follow a daily class schedule 5 days a week. Students have the flexibility to complete coursework before, during, and after school, seven days a week. All online students will engage in a blend of live, online instruction with their teachers and peers as well as offline, independent learning activities.

### **Time Tracker Electronic Log**

All online and offline instructional time students spend on academic tasks will count toward the required weekly minimum instructional minutes which are outlined in the following table. Students and parents will record instructional minutes using the Time Tracker Electronic Log in Synergy StudentVUE and ParentVUE. Instructional minutes can be recorded in Time Tracker seven days a week, at any time of day, as students complete online and offline academic activities. Families will be provided training and support for the use of Time Tracker during initial onboarding training.





## **Technology Expectations**



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



## **Extracurricular Clubs and Sports**

The Alhambra Elementary School District strives to educate the whole child placing value on academics and extracurricular endeavors that inspire students to explore different interests and talents. In support of local school efforts, we offer a rich variety of extracurricular arts, athletics, and club opportunities.

Participation in these activities will encourage the development of leadership skills, sportsmanship, creativity, commitment, accountability, and a true sense of belonging for our students. Throughout the year, students will be able to:

- Participate in a variety of activities of their choice
- Develop individual skills as well as cooperative group behaviors
- Develop social, emotional, and physical skills that can be used throughout their lives
- Take risks
- Build positive self esteem
- Flourish in a safe and healthy environment
- Work alongside coaches and sponsors as role models in their development

Each site offers a variety of after-school activities that may include Athletics, Art Club, Band, Drama, Engineering Club, MESA, Student Council, Yearbook, and many others. These activities are held on various days and times depending on grade level and site schedule. If your child is selected to participate in the afterschool program you will be notified and a permission slip to attend will be provided.

### Eligibility

In order to be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities, a student must meet identified academic and behavior standards according to Board Policy JJJ:

Students who, upon having their work checked on a cumulative basis at the beginning and mid-term of each 10 week sports season where applicable, show that they are not working to capacity and have one (1) or more failing grades will be removed from any athletic teams or extracurricular activities. After improving their respective grades such that they are passing on a cumulative basis, they shall be reinstated to the teams or extracurricular activities until a subsequent check is performed unless ineligible for some reason other than academic performance.

- The eligibility criterion for extracurricular participation shall be a passing grade in all classes in which the student is enrolled
- Students whose behavior presents a problem or jeopardizes school discipline may be ineligible for participation in extracurricular activities until such time as their behavior warrants reinstatement by the site administration
- If a student is absent from school, regardless of the reason, the student will not be allowed to participate in any extracurricular function on the evening of the day on which the absence occurs. Participation in weeknight activities is not an excuse for absence on the day following the activity
- The same general standards shall apply for special education students except that such eligibility shall be determined on a case-by-case basis in relationship to the respective students' individual education plan.



# How is the online learning experience different from the in-person learning experience?

Students participating in Alhambra's Online Learning Academy will:

- Be provided flexible scheduling options for time, place and pace of learning.
- Attend classes on their laptop or mobile devices via our Canvas learning platform.
- Connect with their teachers via Webex for independent or small group supports.
- Are able work independently and self-pace their learning.
- Are given the opportunity to personalize their learning pathway by selecting courses that are unique to their specific interests.
- Students submit course work and communicate with teachers online.

# How do I know my child is safe on the internet and when using email during online learning?

- The district has a robust security filter that ensures any student using a district provided device is protected from access to online predators and inappropriate content.
- All online students will participate in an onboarding course that will cover internet safety and digital citizenship expectations.

#### Will my child be provided with a device to access online learning or do they need to use a personal device from home?

- The district will provide all online learners with an iPad AND a laptop for online learning.
- Students who would like to use their personal device may do so but it is important to note that the district's security filter will NOT block access to any content on the web when a personal device is used.

# If my family needs support with internet connectivity will the district provide this support?

- Yes, families needing support with internet connectivity will be assisted with signing up for the Cox to Compete program.
- Families who do not qualify for the Cox to Compete program will be provided with a district T-Mobile Hotspot.
- Only one device can be used for each T-Mobile Hotspot.

### Frequently Asked Questions Supplemental Program Supports

 My child has an IEP or 504. Will they still receive accommodations in the online setting?

Yes. The Online Academy and district teams will collaborate to review the student's IEP and/or 504 and identify accommodations specific to the online environment. The team will ensure accommodations outlined in the student's IEP and/or 504 are provided throughout the student's course work.

- My child is an English Language Learner. Will they still receive target and integrated EL minutes? Yes. The Online Academy and district teams will collaborate to ensure the student's schedule is organized so that they continue to receive English language instructional minutes and supports.
- How will the Online Academy support students if they fall behind in coursework?

If a student falls behind or is struggling to complete coursework, the online leadership team will collaborate with the student and their parent/guardian to develop a Student Support and Re-engagement Plan. The plan will seek to identify the root cause of the student's struggle, develop interventions to support the student, and monitor the response to those interventions as needed.

#### **ACTION REQUIRED: PARENT / GUARDIAN**

All parents/guardians must sign and acknowledge that they have been informed of the *Alhambra Elementary School District 2021-2022 Selected Student Policies and Regulations Handbook* and the *2021-2022 K-8 Online Academy Student and Parent Handbook*. Parents have the opportunity to read the Handbooks and review them with their child/children. Parents/Guardians understand that they may contact the Principal if there are any questions about the information contained in these Handbooks.
